Snow Update 3/8/2013 4:00 PM

Looks like this could be a big one. Forecasts are trending toward more snow... 8"-14" now. Warnings are out for downed powerlines, recomendations are out for flashlights and extra food.

Snow is expected to begin accumulating at 2:00 AM. There is very little possibility that we will be able to begin operations before morning. That makes things much worse for us since we will have to move around the city in daytime traffic.

We are adding staff to handle the storm. But this snow will be wet and very heavy. It will break our equipment. We have spare trucks, machines, parts and a mechanic on staff. We will do our best over the next 48 hours but it will be difficult.

Recomendations are to limit travel to emergencies only. Looks like a cozy weekend at home is in order.

It looks like we will be working through Sunday, possibly into Sunday night.
