Snow Update 4/22/2013 10:00 PM

Another Spring storm is upon us with the same poor timing. We have spotters driving around town at this moment watching for accumulations. We will begin services as soon as we reach the specified amounts.

The National Weather Service says this storm will begin this evening and quickly build intensity. Predictions are for very heavy snow, 5"-11" with accumulations of over an inch an hour.

An inch an hour is a lot! We have not seen that kind of intensity for years. It means visibility will be less than a few hundred feet... that's a serious snow storm.

Regarding the timing, if we do not reach adequate accumulations by midnight, we won't be able to service sites before sunrise. If we get there by 3:00 AM, we can get about half our work done. According to the NWS, all sites services before 3:00 AM will have another 3"-4" on them by morning anyway. We will do the best we can.

Clouds and snow will last until after noon with cool temperatures so we may not get a lot of melting. We will continue services through the day.

On a brighter note, a week from today we are supposed to have 70 degrees and rain. A good start to a nice, wet spring season.
